We cannot accept that, if this is allowed to happen we shall have no privacy at all, and be totally overlooked by this development.

I realise that open plan is the latest fashion, but some common sense and consideration for the elderly and infirm should be used.

More than 21 days have elapsed since I received the notification, but I will make my comments anyway, and hope that they might be considered.

My flat is on the north side of Shiemohr, and therefore is slightly affected by the proposed development. My flat is already darkened (during the summer months) by a huge sycamore tree, and recently by a huge shed constructed to house the tank for the sprinkler system, which also involved the removal of the previously available drying area.

It seems strange to squeeze eight houses into such a small space, impinging on other dwellings, when there is more open available space owned by the council, in Ballater.

I understand that the play area is to be relocated in another small open space, which is within a few yards of the A93 main road, and well away from the council houses, where the children who use the play area, live.

My main concern is the security of residents in Shiemohr. It seems that a right of way exists through the grounds of Shiemohr, and every day people pass close to my window, on foot or ~~bicycle~~ bicycle. Up to now, this has been no problem, but with eight more families able to use it, I would like assurance that they will be shut off from it, and that there will be a secure fence to ~~guarantee~~ guarantee the residents' privacy.

Also, in my ignorance, I wonder what happens under the ground! Are the sewage pipes prepared for the extra waste, and will this affect Shiemohr? (I already wonder about the tree roots!)
