

I refer to the above application and wish to register our objections.

- 1. Yet again the Agents for the co-op development are seeking retrospective approval for work they have carried out for which they had no authority, continuing a practice which has dominated this development.
- Current use of external lighting has caused us significant nuisance problems
 over the last year, particularly during the winter months.
 It attracts local youths who use the car park, as a floodlit football pitch, particularly
 between the hours of 8.30 -11.00
- 3. This results in continuous thumping of footballs against the walls, our fence, the bus shelter, not forgetting the balls being kicked into our garden, against vehicles in our driveway, and the house itself.
- 4. Advised by the police, we have recorded over 40 such incidents between Sept and May, many of which we have had to call the police about. They will have a record of such incidents/calls.
 - This has already escalated to our fence being vandalised, the tree at the bus stop destroyed, and on 2 occassions, laser lights being shone into our house because we have complained and the police took action.
- 5. The police will confirm that the lighting is the attraction for youths to gather and play football. No such incidents ever occurred when Waltzing Waters operated the site, and all lighting was extinguished at 4pm.
- 6. Finally, we would add that lighting from the shop entrance and the strret lights are more than sufficient to illuminate the car park for customers, and we would urge you to reject this retrospective application.
